Position Summary

Under general supervision, the Quality Assurance Representative will monitor and evaluate all maintenance actions to ensure safe and reliable aircraft are provided in accordance with current technical manuals, directions, and instructions applicable to the maintenance program.

The following education and experience; essential functions; knowledge, skills, and abilities; physical demands; and work environment are generally representative of the minimum or preferred requirements to enter the job and capably perform the duties and responsibilities. Reasonable

Education, Work Experience, and Licenses

- High School Diploma/GED and completion of U.S. military aircraft mechanic and/or airframe courses and/or FAA Airframe and Powerplant (A&P) technical school.
- Eight years' experience in general aircraft maintenance.
- Equivalent combination of training, education, and experience in a relevant field or industry.
- FAA A&P license required.
- Valid State Driver License.

Essential Functions Required

The essential functions for this position may include, but are not limited to:

- Monitor contract compliance by all maintenance activities through the audit and surveillance requirements as defined in the Quality Assurance Manual.
- Perform final inspections of all maintenance actions involving safety of flight or requiring certification by an Aircraft Inspector, except ejection seats and canopy systems.
- Investigate safety incidents and assist in preparation of Engineering Investigation Request, Quality Deficiency Reports, Hazardous Material Reports, Technical Publications Deficiency Reports, and Explosive Mishap Reporting as required.
- Review applicable maintenance forms and deficiency data to determine discrepancy trends and specific problem areas.
- Assist in drafting and development of work instructions, maintenance instructions, local
 maintenance requirement cards, and routine and continuing correspondence to all work centers
 detailing maintenance and program procedures and requirements.
- Provide briefing and debriefing of Functional Check Flight pilots.
- Assist in preparation of Quality Assurance monthly Data Requirements.
- Assist in preparation of weekly, monthly, and quarterly Quality Assurance Control Status Report for inclusion in report to Program Management.
- Operate Flightdocs database information system.
- Review incoming technical publications and directives to determine their application to the Maintenance Department, if required
- Ensure compliance with and monitor all established general and industrial safety rules and regulations as applicable to the contract, facility, and job assignment.
- Ensure safety, security, and preservation of all equipment.
- Ensure compliance with Foreign Object Damage (FOD), Hazardous Waste, Egress Familiarization, Hydraulic Contamination, Oil Surveillance, and tool control programs.
- Maintain cleanliness of work center.
- May be assigned as subject matter expert (SME) or training instructor as required.
- Other duties as assigned.*

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities (KSAs)

- Demonstrated knowledge of DCMA INST 8210.
- Knowledgeable of Quality Assurance procedures.
- Knowledgeable of applicable safety manuals.
- Knowledgeable of applicable maintenance or technical manuals and publications, technical directives, safety procedures, ground support equipment, and special tools.

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- Ability to research, read, and interpret aircraft drawings.
- Ability to brief and debrief Functional Check Flight pilots in requirements for functional check flights and expected results.
- Strong PC-based computer skills; proficiency utilizing various software such as Microsoft Office; web-based e-mail/calendar applications; virtual office/cloud-based file sharing (i.e., G-Suite/Google for Work, Google Hangouts, GoToMeeting, etc.); and Flightdocs database system.
- Ability to manage files and maintain records in compliance with standard or required recordkeeping practices.
- Strong, effective communication skills, both verbally and in writing, with emphasis on sharing or transmitting technical information with clarity and accuracy.
- Ability to plan and carry work through to completion with accuracy and attention to detail.
- Ability to comfortably manage multiple tasks and projects utilizing time management and organization skills.
- Knowledge of proper telephone and email practices and etiquette.

Supervisory Responsibility

Physical Demands

- Requires physical movements and postures normally associated with an airport hangar/shop/flight line environment.
- Extended periods of special vision requirements including close vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and ability to adjust and focus.
- Periodic periods of sitting.
- Periodic use of desktop/laptop computer and peripheral equipment.
- Regular stooping, standing, and carrying.
- Regular lifting up to 50 pounds or more (with assistance, if required).
- Regular use of hands and fingers to handle, feel, or operate objects, tools, or controls; reaching with hands and arms.
- Frequently required to actively talk, listen, and hear.
- Regularly ascend/descend stairs.

Work Environment

While performing the duties of this position, employees may encounter the following, but not limited to, work situations:

- Aircraft hangar or warehouse environment with exposure to high noise hazards; fumes from engines, chemicals, and airborne particles; electrical shock hazards; and trip or slip hazards.
- The diversity of work conditions may include unpredictable climate and severe changes in temperatures and weather.
- May be required to wear protective clothing or other safety equipment.
- May be required to interpret Material Safety Data Sheets and handle hazardous materials and chemicals.
- May require the use of a respirator.
- Standard hours are Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- Occasional evening, weekend, holiday, and overtime work may be required.
- Regular travel to various work sites throughout the U.S. may be required.

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Work Authorization/Security Clearance

- Completion and submission of a U.S. government I-9 Form.
- Eligibility for a U.S. government security clearance may be required.
